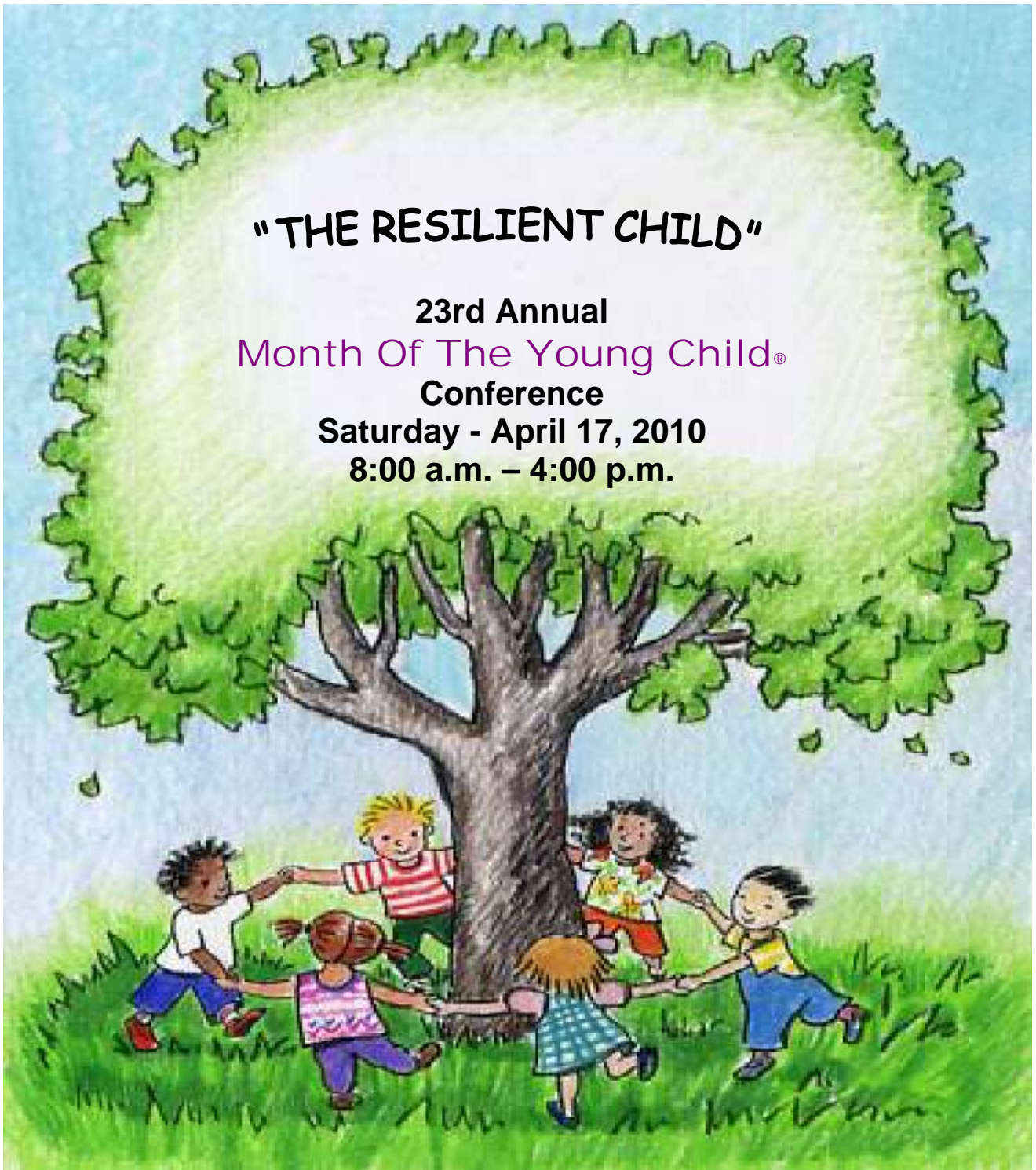

Exit 204, toward Southfield Hwy. take exit 3 toward Outer Dr. Turn slight LEFT onto Southfield Rd. turn slight RIGHT onto Enterprise Dr.

From Western Wayne:

I-96 E JeffriesFwy via the ramp on the left. Keep right to take I-96 Local E. Take the M-39/Southfield Fwy exit; exit 183. Merge onto MI-39S/Southfield FWy.
